Evidence suggest pain assessments and pre-medication be a routine part of dressing changes to aid in comfort, anxiety reduction, and well-being. Members of the health care team must develop the skills and competence associated with wound management, paying close attention to pain management. Proper pain management relies heavily on performing a thorough assessment followed by the administration of appropriate analgesic medication, allowing optimal time for analgesia to occur.
