This autobiographical narrative provides an alternative perspective of World War I, recounting the experiences of a Roman

schoolboy who volunteered to fight against the Allies after Italy surrendered in 1943. But he is not sent to the front. Instead, with professional soldiers from the Russian front and fanatical fascists, he fights in the civil war that raged in Mussolini's puppet state. He is captured in Milan after the German surrender and is spared execution by his captors, boys of his own age.

In Search of a Glorious Death 5Continents

In the middle years of the Great Depression, Erskine Caldwell and photographer Margaret Bourke-White

spent eighteen months traveling across the back roads of the Deep South--from South Carolina to Arkansas--to document the living conditions of the sharecropper. Their collaboration resulted in *You Have Seen Their Faces*, a graphic portrayal of America's desperately poor rural underclass. First published in 1937, it is a classic comparable to Jacob Riis's *How the Other Half Lives*, and James Agee and Walker Evans's *Let Us Now Praise Famous Men*, which it preceded by more than three years. Caldwell lets the poor speak for themselves. Supported by his commentary, they tell how the tenant system exploited whites and blacks alike and fostered animosity between them. Bourke-White, who sometimes waited hours for the right moment, captures her subjects in the shacks where they lived, the depleted fields where they plowed, and the churches where they worshipped. *Salvatore Arancio. The photographs range from social documentary works of the 1950s to the conceptual photography of the 1970s, more personal explorations and travelogues of the 1980s and contemporary photographic remappings of Italian cities. This thematic interpretation conveys the incredibly vital and diverse range of expressions that have unfolded in Italian photography over the past five decades. Definire il cinema di prossimità, concetto sotto cui si associano esperienze solo apparentemente lontane, come il cinema privato e quello underground. Questo è

l'obiettivo di questo libro, ridisegnare i confini di categorie critiche superate e automatiche. Tracciare un percorso trasversale che unisca cinema familiare e cinema sperimentale, all'insegna dell'innovazione, della libertà dalle convenzioni industriali e di mercato. Mappando scritture per immagini emancipate dalla narrazione usuale, dal canone generale. Opere familiari o avanguardiste, che chiedono di essere guardate con occhi scevri da sovrastrutture, privi sia di significati intellettuali preconfezionati che della perversa brama contemporanea del divertimento a tutti i costi. Il cinema di prossimità va al nucleo pulsante delle cose, è cinema amatoriale nel senso etimologico, amoroso: domanda di essere esperito senza pregiudizi, fa tabula rasa dei vizi interpretativi, si mostra a cuore aperto offrendo porzioni di vita. Spesso raggiunge, con l'ostinata osservazione della realtà, la consistenza astratta della pittura. Sotto l'egida di Roger Odin e schierato, come Stan Brakhage, in difesa del cineamatore, il cinema di prossimità guarda alla produzione di immagini con l'intento di restituire dignità - artistica,

storica e sociologica - a gesti cinematografici semplici eppure straordinariamente complessi, intimi e rivoluzionari, costantemente e ottusamente sottovalutati quando non derisi. Ilaria Pezone è docente presso l'Accademia di Brera. Dal 2009 si dedica allo studio e alla pratica del cinema privato. Ha realizzato, fra gli altri, *Andare* tornando a rilievi domestici (2011), *Masse* nella geometria rivelata dello spazio tempo (2012), *Ego etiam advenus* (2013), *Vedere tra*, Luigi Erba improvviso e dialogato (2015), *Concerto metafisico* (2015), *Indagine su sei brani di vita rumorosa* dispersi in un'estate afosa - raccolti e scomposti in cinque atti (2016), *Con lievi mani* (2017) e *France*, quasi un autoritratto (2017). Women Photographers and Feminist Aesthetics makes the case for a feminist aesthetics in photography by analysing key works of twenty-two women photographers, including cis- and trans-woman photographers. Claire Raymond provides close readings of key

photographs spanning the history of photography, from nineteenth-century Europe to twenty-first century Africa and Asia. She offers original interpretations of well-known photographers such as Diane Arbus, Sally Mann, and Carrie Mae Weems, analysing their work in relation to gender, class, and race. The book also pays close attention to the way in which indigenous North Americans have been represented through photography and the ways in which contemporary Native American women photographers respond to this history. Developing the argument that through aesthetic force emerges the truly political, the book moves beyond polarization of the aesthetic and the cultural. Instead, photographic works are read for their subversive political and cultural force, as it emerges through the aesthetics of the image.  In this beautifully illustrated book Maria Antonella Pelizzari traces the history of photography in Italy from its beginnings to the present as she guides us through the history of Italy and its ancient sites and Renaissance landmarks. Pelizzari specifically considers the role of photography in the formation of Italian national identity during times of political struggle, such as the lead up to Unification in 1860, and later in the nationalist wars of Mussolini's regime. While many Italians and foreigners— such as Fratelli Alinari or Carlo Ponti, John Ruskin or Kit Talbot—focused their lenses on architectural masterpieces, others documented the changing times and political heroes, creating icons of figures such as Garibaldi and the brigands. Pelizzari's exploration of Italian visual traditions also includes the photographic collages of Bruno Munari, the neorealist work of photographers such as Franco Pinna, the bold stylized compositions of Mario Giacomelli, and the controversial images created by Oliviero Toscani for Benetton advertising in the 1980s.

Featuring unpublished works and a rare selection of over one hundred images, this book will appeal to art collectors and students of art history and Italian culture.

 This unique work brings together seventy portraits of the great Lamas (teachers) of Tibet. The Dalai Lama, Tibet's spiritual and temporal leader, exiled in India since China invaded his country in 1959, has personally indicated the Lamas to be photographed for the book. He wrote the compelling foreword, and believes that this volume will have an important historical value: as keepers of ancient Buddhist wisdom passed on through oral tradition, the Lamas depicted here are the guardians of the vast knowledge of Tibetan culture. The photographs have never been published before, and the sober black-and-white images convey the extraordinary personalities of these teachers, focusing exclusively on the human and the spiritual, rather than the

overtly religious. As a result, the portraits make genuine contact with the profound gaze of these great masters. Photographer Melina Mulas embarked on this project in 1991, and has traveled the world to meet and photograph the Lamas. The exhibition reunites surviving preparatory drawings and paintings, as well as documentary photos, for an extraordinary lost fresco cycle by the Venetian painter Giambattista Tiepolo (1696-1770). This first published monograph by Domingo Milella is a photographic journey from his hometown in the outskirts of Bari in southern Italy, taking us to Mexico City, Cairo, Ankara, Anatolia, Sicily, Tunisia, and as far as Mesopotamia. Milella's subject is cities and their borders, cemeteries and villages, caves and homes, tombs and hieroglyphs - in short, signs of man's presence on earth. His interest is the

overlap between civilisation and nature, and how landscape and architecture are invested with individual and collective memory. These photographs emerge from and challenge classical ideas of landscape in art history, and seek an alternative iconography in which an almost forgotten past coexists with the present. Says Milella: "Making images doesn't only mean documenting or taking photographs. It's also a possibility for contemplation and recollection. Building an image of the past is to face the present, and activate the possibility of the future."

Encyclopedia of Nineteenth-Century Photography Charta

This richly illustrated book is a monument to modern urban construction in Naples. It features some fifty new photos by celebrated French photographer Cyrille Weiner as well as historic images and drawings of important architectonic details, and an atlas of eighteen significant buildings dating from 1930-1960 illustrated with site and floor plans, elevations, and sections. It reveals how this southern Italian metropolis developed its own form of modernism, one that combined Mediterranean culture with local

materials and a strong internationalist spirit. The topical essays and concise descriptions of the documented buildings,

together with the lavish illustrations make for a hugely attractive and lively portrait of Naples. This fascinating city is both famous and infamous--but its qualities and

individuality in terms of architecture and urban development really should be better known.
