The philosophy of normalization and promotion of the plight of children and adults with mental handicaps has drawn more public attention in recent years. Governments in a number of countries have embarked upon policies involving the closure of institutions, movement of people with mental handicaps back into the community, and development of community-orientated programmes, although their reasons for this may be economically, rather than ideologically, motivated. Occupational therapists have moved into the community, along with other health professionals, in order to set up community services for people with mental handicaps. My own experience of working in a multidisciplinary team in Central London for 20 years, helping adults with mental handicaps to move out of an institution, has been a source of motivation to write this book. The amount of written material available on the occupational therapy approach to resettlement and deinstitutionalization is limited, in comparison with the massive amount of information written by, and for, other practitioners. Additionally, the number of texts written by and for occupational therapists with this client group are few. Despite excellent support from OT colleagues, I

experienced considerable frustration trying to define and perform my role, not helped by a shortage of texts to draw on.

This study was conducted to compare whole practice versus part practice with regard to the motor learning and retention of a novel task, one handed dressing, among 31 college females age 18-26 in a pre-occupational therapy course or their first semester of the occupational therapy program at Eastern Kentucky University. The participants were assigned to one of the two research conditions: whole or part practice of the one handed dressing task. After completing practice and following a rest period/intervening task, a retention test of one handed dressing was videotaped by the researcher. Two trained volunteer research assistants analyzed the videotaped retention tests and

rated them for Movement Time (MT) and Response Errors (RE). Due to high inter-rater reliability, the scores for the two research assistants were averaged for the purposes of statistical analysis. The results of the study indicated statistically significant differences in the retention tests of the two research conditions. Participants in the whole practice condition completed the one handed dressing task in less time (MT) and with fewer errors (RE) than participants in the part practice research condition. These findings support previous research regarding whole practice in general, and the findings have great potential to influence new and developing motor learning theories, such as the contemporary task-oriented approach, as well as clinical practice within the occupational therapy profession.
